Glenleigh's 2015 Year in Review

2015 saw a lot of activity and progress in Glenleigh, including our neighborhood's 30th Anniversary. In May, the new Board was elected and immediately got to work updating community resources and kicking off a few improvement projects.

- ⇒ The refreshed Glenleigh website was launched, featuring easy access to the Covenants, important MRC information, newsletter archive and community links.
- ⇒ Landscaping improvements were started in the common areas, with new shrubs and trees planted, a new retaining wall installed and stairs replaced leading from the pool to the tennis courts.
- ⇒ The filtration system on the swimming pool was upgraded and repaired.
- ⇒ New lighting was installed at the pool area, and lighting around the tennis courts was replaced.
- ⇒ The Social Committee planned several fun events, including the August pool party commemorating Glenleigh's 30th birthday.
- ⇒ New holiday lights/decorations were purchased and installed in the entry.

Coming in 2016

- ⇒ Landscaping improvements continue with clearing out overgrown brush around the Nickajack Road entry area and entry island.
- ⇒ The playground will get a refresh with new edging and groundcover, as well as repairs to the playset.
- ⇒ Deteriorated edging around the parking lot will be replaced with more durable materials.
- ⇒ Staining/ sealant of retention wall, playground area, steps, and parking lot timbers for a cohesive look. (This is a job we hope to get several homeowners to pitch in and help with as it does not require any expertise beyond cleaning and painting. Look for a notice about our annual cleanup day this spring.)
- ⇒ Cracks in the tennis court are being monitored and will be repaired if needed.
- ⇒ New umbrellas will be purchased for the pool area.
- ⇒ Mosquito abatement in the common areas will continue, including the cleaning out of the retention pond to help with this issue.

Christmas Tree Recycling

"Bring One for the Chipper" is Georgia's annual Christmas tree recycling program. You can bring your tree to either of these Home Depot locations on **January 2, 2016** to have it recycled into mulch to be used for playgrounds, local government beautification projects, and individual yards.

HOME DEPOT—2450 Cumberland Parkway OR HOME DEPOT—1200 East-West Connector

Be sure to remove all lights, wire, tinsel, ornaments, nails, stands, other non-organic decorative materials and other materials that are not part of the original tree. This includes tree stands also. Flocked trees are usually accepted, but not artificial trees.
